

ADULT CAT VACCINATIONS

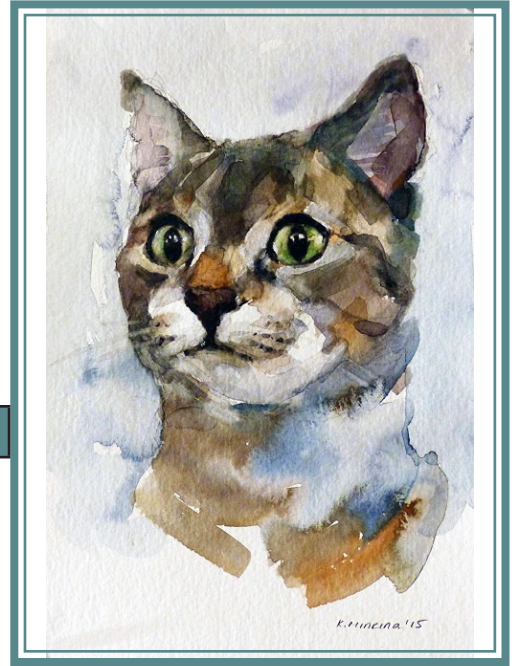
Fairfield VH recommends yearly health examinations and vaccinations for all adult cats. Rabies vaccinations are given within the specified guidelines of the law. Your veterinarian will examine your cat at each visit and is included in the fee schedule.

FDRC Combination

Feline Distemper Highly contagious. Fever, appetite loss, vomiting, diarrhea, dehydration, and death.

Rhinotracheitis Respiratory disease affects upper air passages and lungs

Calicivirus Severe fever, inactivity, vomiting and diarrhea that is often bloody. High mortality rate, particularly in

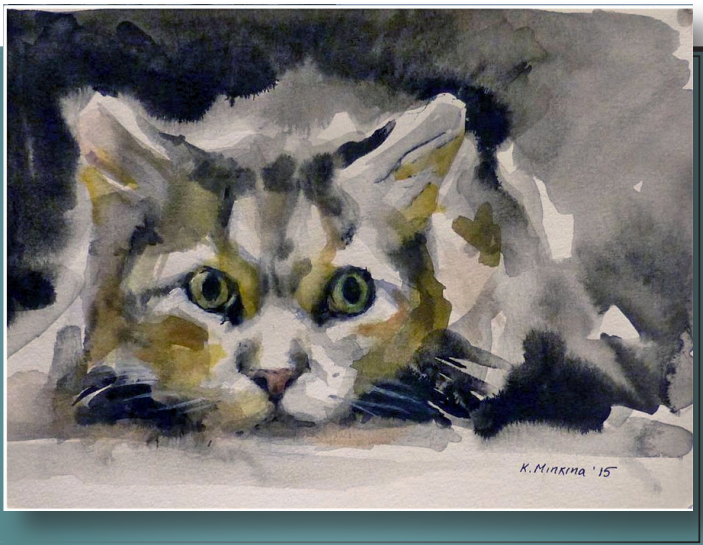


LEUKEMIA	RABIES
Highly contagious viral disease that is a major cause of death in cats	Severe damage to the central nervous system which can progress to paralysis and death. Contagious to humans this vaccination is required by law.



Vaccines

Receiving a quality vaccination is imperative to protect your pet from disease. Vials that are not shipped, handled or stored correctly can render them weak or impotent. Fairfield Veterinary Hospital adheres to strict handling and storage protocols to ensure your pet's health and safety.



Kitten VACCINATIONS

We recommend that kittens receive vaccinations at 8 and 12 weeks of age. The veterinarian will examine your kitten at each visit.

Age	FDRC	Leukemia	Rabies
8 weeks	1st	1st	
12 weeks	2nd	2nd	1st

Sometimes breeders have an extra FDRC set done at 6 weeks. This set should be repeated at 8, and 12 weeks.
